The meeting opened at 7:00 pm.

Members present were Merlin Mowery, Carl Habrick, Dianne Davis, Larry Sines, Joe Orban, Bonnie Peters, and Doris Kemner.

Motion was made by Kemner and seconded by Peters to approve the March 3, 2014 open and closed council minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

The public hearing opened at 7:07 pm. The purpose of the hearing was to receive public comments on a proposed change in the zoning of the property at 829 Tecumseh Road from Highway Service Commercial or Low Density Residential to Light Industrial. Comments were made by Jay Hughes and Jason Potter from Eden Foods and Ms. Nancy Hammond 101 Bartlett Street. The public hearing closed at 7:19 pm.

The public hearing opened at 7:26 pm. The purpose of the hearing was to receive public comments on the proposed 2014-15 Village, Smith-Kimball Community Center, and DDA tax levies and the proposed Village budget for the fiscal year. The public hearing closed at 7:28 pm.

Motion was made by Peters and seconded by Kemner to adopt Resolution Number 2014-03. A resolution to approve the 2014-15 Village, Smith-Kimball Community Center, and DDA tax levies and the proposed Village budget for the fiscal year. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Kemner and seconded by Davis to approve the checks written for the period ending March 31, 2014. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Peters and seconded by Sines to adopt Ordinance Number 2014-03. An Ordinance to delete Section 62-51 through 62-59 of the Code of Ordinances for the Village of Clinton and replace them with new regulations on cross connection with the public water system. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Orban and seconded by Davis to adopt Ordinance Number 2014-04. An Ordinance to adopt regulations for the Village's public water system. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Peters and seconded by Sines to adopt Ordinance Number 2014-05. An ordinance to change the zoning of the property 829 Tecumseh Road from Highway Service Commercial or low Density Residential to Light Industrial. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Orban and seconded by Davis to adopt Resolution Number 2014-04. A resolution to amend the water and sewer rates and charges. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Kemner and seconded by Davis to adopt Resolution Number 2014-05. A resolution to add a portion of Oak Tree Street, Edward J. Street and Harvest Drive to the Village of Clinton street system pursuant to MDOT regulations. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Peters and seconded by Habrick to adopt Resolution Number 2014-06. A resolution to add a portion of Calhoun Drive to the Village of Clinton street system pursuant to MDOT regulations. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Habrick and seconded by Peters to approve the fire department increasing its rescue service to Basic Life Support. Motion carried unanimously

Motion was made by Davis and seconded by Orban to support Clinton Township holding an election to request one additional mill for road maintenance and improvements. Motion carried with Habrick voting no.

Motion was made by Kemner and seconded by Davis to approve the invoice in the amount of \$2,000 to Lenawee Economic Development Corp. Motion carried with Habrick voting no.

Motion was made by Sines and seconded by Orban to adopt Ordinance Number 2014-06. An Ordinance to establish one regular Council meeting on the first Monday of each month. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Peters and seconded by Sines to support the 2014 Taste of Lenawee event. Motion carried with Orban voting no.

Motion was made by Kemner and seconded by Peters to support the Veterans Memorial Park improvements. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Peters and seconded by Davis to receive and file the Council information packet. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Habrick and seconded by Peters to amend the Brush policy. Motion carried unanimously.

The Village Manager reported that Police Officer Rob Trevino was given a Crime Victims Award.

The following comments were from Council. Carl Habrick was concerned about the water at the compost site. Bonnie Peters wanted to make sure Tate Park would be open for the Easter Egg Hunt.

Motion was made by Habrick and seconded by Peters to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.

The meeting adjourned at 8:50 pm.
