

Village of Clinton  
March 12, 2018

The meeting opened at 7:00 pm.

Member Present were President Doris Kemner, Carl Habrick, Larry Sines, Joe Orban, Bonnie Peters, Greg Michalak and Merlin Mowery.

Motion was made by Mowery and seconded by Sines to approve the February 12, 2018 council minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Sines and seconded by Peters to approve the checks written for the period ending February 28, 2018. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Orban and seconded by Michalak to award the water treatment plant bids to the following companies: Westech to furnish the duplex pressure filter system (\$134,600), Stahley Excavating to install piping and wash water infiltration basin (\$63,200), Brint Electric to install conduit and wiring (\$4,250) and Cribley Well Drilling to install Well 4, pump and abandon Well 1 (\$5,000). Motion carried unanimously.

Council discussed the preliminary 2018-19 budget and tax rates.

The Clinton Fire Board recommends Council and the Township adopt the 2018-19 fire budget and pay for medical calls.

Motion was made by Mowery and seconded by Sines to pay \$10.00 per hour for medical calls from 7:00 am to 10:59 pm, \$15.00 per hour for medical calls from 11:00 pm to 6:59 am and eliminating the medical license bonus. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Sines and seconded by Habrick to approve the 2018-19 fire budget. Motion carried unanimously.

Council discussed and made some suggestions on the design for community entrance signs.

Council was told about the AMP Public Power Training Program for elected and appointed officials.

Council discussed the draft ordinance for accessory structures and setback requirements. Council had some concerns they want the Planning Commission to address.

Council discussed the proposed RV ordinance. Council had some concerns they want the Planning Commission to address.

Motion was made by Habrick and seconded by Mowery to receive and file the Council information packet. Motion carried unanimously.

The Village Manager reported on the Comcast press release of their new 1 gigabit-per-second internet service, a plan to encourage the turkey vultures to relocate, the Village is going to prepare sidewalk repair notices, having a temporary sign on the Tate Park pedestrian bridge for soccer sign ups, the Village is working with the Little League to renew their field use agreement.

There were no Council comments.

President Doris Kemner expressed the need for condominiums in the Village, the need for senior citizen transportation, and asked for an update on Carriage Hills Subdivision.

Motion was made by Habrick and seconded by Sines to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.
