

Village of Clinton
October 7, 2013

The meeting opened at 7:00 pm.

Members present were President Mowery, Carl Habrick, Dianne Davis, Larry Sines, Joe Orban, Doris Kemner, and Bonnie Peters.

Motion was made by Peters and seconded by Kemner to approve the September 9, 2013 council minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Sean McNatt, Superintendent of Clinton Community Schools, introduced himself to Council.

Motion was made by Peters and seconded by Kemner to approve the checks written for the period ending September 30, 2013. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Habrick and seconded by Peter to execute the Professional Services Agreement to appoint Ty Greenleaf as the Farmer's Market Coordinator. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Peters and seconded by Sines to approve the MML Liability and Property Pool ballot as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Council discussed the Asset Management Plan the US EPA and MDEQ are requiring communities to prepare for storm water systems, wastewater collection systems, and wastewater treatment plants.

Council was updated on the wastewater treatment plant contaminated soil.

Council was updated on the Strategic Planning Statement. Discussions with departments will be scheduled for future council meetings.

The Planning Commission is making final adjustments to the sign ordinance amendments. After the document is finalized there will be public hearings scheduled.

The community event calendar in the new website will start with Village information. At some point in the future Council will discuss expanding the type of events allowed on the calendar.

Motion was made by Peters and seconded by Davis to receive and file the council information packet. Motion carried unanimously.

The Village Manager discussed the downtown holiday lights; an email from the township about a possible road millage; and problems with the irrigation system at Tate

Park.

The following comments were from Council. Dianne Davis asked if the December council meeting could be changed to December 9th. Bonnie Peters had a concern about a section of sidewalk related to the Consumers Energy gas line replacement project; congratulated the Fall Festival Committee on another wonderful Fall Festival; and that there is a basketball hoop on the sidewalk on Burton Street. Doris Kemner thanked the Village Manager for speaking at the Women's Club; asked if Council should be writing letters to the government about the government shutdown; said the Taste of South East Michigan went well; and thanked the Village employee's for their help during the Fall Festival.

Motion was made by Habrick and seconded by Peters to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.
