

Village of Clinton
July 9, 2012

The meeting opened at 7:00 pm.

Members present were President Mowery, Carl Habrick, Dianne Davis, Larry Sines, Joe Orban, Bonnie Peters, and Doris Kemner.

Motion was made by Peters and seconded by Sines to approve the June 4, 2012 and June 11, 2012 Council minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Kemner and seconded by Orban to approve the checks written for the period ending June 30, 2012. Motion carried unanimously.

Council and two representatives from the Youth Soccer Club discussed the proposed Tate Park soccer field improvements.

Council was supportive of the draft notice and bill stuffer outlining the Clinton Fire Department millage renewal.

Motion was made by Habrick and seconded by Sines to appoint Rick Davis, Electric Superintendent, as the alternative representative for the Michigan South Central Power Agency to replace George Service who recently retired. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Davis and seconded by Kemner to accept the MML Workers Compensation 2012 ballot as printed. Motion carried unanimously.

Council was updated on the office improvements. A potential asbestos problem in the tile has delayed the laying of new carpeting.

Council discussed the draft sign ordinance amendments.

Motion was made by Habrick and seconded by Peters to receive and file the council information packet. Motion carried unanimously.

The Village Manager Updated Council on the upcoming audit review, the passing of former officer Rick Villerot, and the need for a new police car and logo change.

The following comments were from Council. Dianne Davis wanted to thank the Make A Wish Foundation for including Clinton in their route. Carl Habrick stated the trash can at the Clinton Local has not been dumped in several weeks and asked if the traffic light at Tecumseh Road and Franklin Street could set to flashing in the summer while school was out. Doris Kemner asked if the Village has a handicap stencil the United Church of Christ could use for marking parking spots.

President Mowery congratulated Kevin Cornish for winning the American Public Power Association 2012 Seven Hats Award and expressed concern about the cost of the proposed ballot issue to have 25 percent renewable power by 2025.

Motion was made by Habrick and seconded by Peters to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.
