

The Village of Clinton 2017 Annual Summary

For the Energy Waste Reduction and Renewable Energy Plans

In 2016 the Michigan Legislature passed Public Act 342 (PA 342), which amended Public Act 295. Public Act 342 continues the goals of helping Michigan residents reduce their energy needs and requires all Michigan electric utilities to file an annual summary to its customers. The Village of Clinton continues to meet the State of Michigan renewable and energy waste reduction requirements of 2016 PA 342.

This report summarizes the Village of Clinton's efforts for both Energy Waste Reduction and Renewable Energy for 2017.

Energy Waste Reduction

In 2017, the Village of Clinton continued its Energy Waste Reduction program with the distribution of energy saving compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs). In addition, 31 streetlights were upgraded to LEDs. The total cost of these programs was \$19,579 and customers saved 215,507 kilowatt hours.

Renewable Energy

To meet the state mandated renewable energy goals for 2017 the Village purchased 2,340 Renewable Energy Credits (RECs). The credits from various Power Purchase Agreements offset the costs of these RECs and left a credit of \$544.24. The Village has met the state requirement of 10% renewable energy.
