

Village of Clinton  
Council Minutes  
June 3, 2019

The meeting opened at 7:02 pm.

Members present were President Doris Kemner, Carl Habrick, Larry Sines, Joe Orban, Bonnie Peters, and Greg Michalak. Kevin Kelly was absent.

Motion was made by Peters and seconded by Orban to approve the May 6, 2019 regular and closed minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

Lenawee County Sheriff Troy Bevier gave an overview of his department and stated that he hopes to continue with the positive relationship they have with the Village of Clinton.

The first Police Professional Excellence Award was presented to Officer Ryan Hillard for going beyond his duty to alert the DPW staff of potential flooding hazard to the lift station during the heavy rains. Thinking outside of his normal duties, Officer Hillard potentially saved the Village thousands of dollars in flood damage to the equipment.

Paul Beckhusen, General Manager, Michigan South Central Power Agency, gave a presentation on Electric Energy and Capacity.

The Village Manger gave an overview of the potential changes to the Agency's organizational structure.

Motion was made by Habrick and seconded by Sines to adopt ordinance number 2019-02, to update the Fireworks Ordinance in accordance with the State of Michigan, bringing the allowable days from around 30 to approximately 12 days. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Michalak and seconded by Peters to adopt ordinance number 2019-03, an ordinance to adopt Flood Plain Management in accordance with FEMA. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Habrick and seconded by Sines to table action on an ordinance to amend the definition of a Community Center. Motion carried unanimously.

The conditional use hearing for the South Alley Parking Lot was opened at 9:00 pm for public comment. No one was in attendance, and the public hearing was closed at 9:01 pm.

Motion was made by Michalak and seconded by Orban to approve the South Alley Parking Lot conditional use. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Orban and seconded by Peters to approve the South Alley Parking Lot site plan review, subject to electric outlets being installed for event use and handicap parking spaces meeting or exceeding code. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Sines and seconded by Peters to approve the checks written for period ending May 31, 2019. Motion carried unanimously.

The Village Manager discussed Sunset Drive water main electrolysis.

Motion was made by Habrick and seconded by Peters to receive and file the Council information packet. Motion carried unanimously.

Council accepted the resignation of Karie Dorsten from the DDA board, and asked that a thank you letter be sent to her for her service.

Motion was made by Habrick and seconded by Peters to appoint Bryan Maves to fill the vacant seat through 2020. Motion carried unanimously.

The Village Manager reported that he attended the Cheeky Pony grand opening. He is working with two property owners along the south alley for an Easement Agreement.

The following comments were from Council. Bonnie Peters mentioned the hail that came through during Summerfest, and the favorable Lead & Copper results from her water test. Carl Habrick asked what Eden Foods was doing to the driveway area of their main building.

Motion was made by Habrick and seconded by Peters to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.

The meeting adjourned at 9:30 pm.
